Description

In this event on World AIDS day, there will be explored the different roles pharmacists can have in the prevention and screening of HIV infections and the care and support to people living with HIV. Pharmacists can play an important support role for people living with HIV, through the management of their medication, education for prevention and treatment, but also through HIV prevention through dispensing and providing support to pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), HIV testing and harm reduction strategies for IV drugs users.

The World Health Organization estimates that around 38 million people live with HIV globally. Although there is still no cure for HIV, with the advancement of therapies and increasing access to effective HIV prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care, including for opportunistic infections, HIV infection has become a manageable chronic health condition, enabling people living with HIV to lead long and healthy lives.
